The crimes of interest – incidents of burglary, criminal damage and thefts – reported for the beat area between 01/01/2020 and 31/01/2020 were –

Burglary Dwelling – 1 (Bole).

Theft of Motor Vehicle – 3 (Clarborough, North Leverton x2).

Theft from Motor Vehicle – 1 (Clarborough).

Theft Other - 1 (Wiseton).

Criminal Damage to a Motor Vehicle – 1 (North Leverton).

(Vehicle Interference – 1 (North Leverton)).

Property Security

As gardeners are starting to think about preparing for the new season ahead, you are advised to lock gates and always make sure that your garages and sheds are locked, secured and ideally alarmed.

If your shed has a window, make sure that it is frosted glass or has a curtain over it so people cannot see what is inside. Mark your tools with your postcode and house number in more than one place, preferably by scratching into the metal or wood. Their value to a thief will be reduced if they are permanently marked in some way. Chain tools and bicycles together, and chain them to a structure of the shed or garage if you can.

Nuisance Phone Calls / Personal Data (a message from PCSO D Airey)

I have received calls raising concerns about nuisance calls; the purpose being to obtain personal details, including bank details, to scam them out of personal finance. The persons who contacted me were contacted by callers purporting to be from HMRC and an adjoining force CID department. Representatives from banks, HMRC and Police forces would never contact residents by telephone to discuss debt, with a view to obtaining personal details from the person who they are calling. Never give personal details to callers over the phone.

Please do not use these telephone numbers to report incidents and/ or crimes. Our works numbers should only be used for non-urgent matters – including seeking advice and/ or information

I continue to receive calls on my works phone from residents wishing to report incidents and crimes. In many cases these calls are received when I am on rest days or annual leave and have not got my works phone to hand. Residents must be comfortable in reporting these occurrences to our control room on 101 in order to receive the best, and real time, service from those officers who are on duty.

When ringing 101 the first item which is asked is which Police force you require. This is because 101 is the non-urgent number for all Police forces throughout the country and the signal is picked up from where you are ringing from. In rural East Bassetlaw many parishes are located close to county boundaries, hence the first question. Then, you are asked if you know the person or extension number of the department you require. At this stage, just hold the line. After this, there are a number of options available. For reporting an incident or crime the option is option 7 – there is no need to listen to all the alternatives before selecting this option number.

Flooding

The Council will be hosting two drop in sessions for members of the public in relation to November's flooding across the District. Representatives from the Environment Agency and County Council will be attending and the public will be able to ask questions about the floods, the response and what preparations are being made for future flooding.

#MentalHealthy Cafes

Mental Health Cafes to open in Worksop for after hours mental health support. The pilot started on 3 February 2020 and will last for 12 weeks at The Crossing, Newcastle Street, Worksop. They will open Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 5pm to 9pm. The venture is being funded by NHS Bassetlaw CCG, set up by MIND Nottinghamshire in partnership with Talkzone. The café will offer a mental healthy safe space to get help without the need for an appointment

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN UPDATE

Bassetlaw District Council held their Rural Conference on 16 January 2020. They shared lots of information about plans for Bassetlaw, They confirmed:

- Cottam Power Station has been earmarked for a large housing development
- High Marnham Power Station is earmarked to be a large industrial/commercial development
- The Trinity area near Idle Valley is to have 440 new homes
- Morton Area from the Rail Crossing at Bark Animal Rescue to the A1 is set to become the new garden village with 750 homes targeted from 2026 rising to 4000 homes in 2037. A railway station is also being considered for the area.

All developments are in a consultation period until the 26th Feb and welcome responses. Full details are available via www.bassetlaw.gov.uk/bassetlawplan

The Neighbourhood Plan Working Party has now appointed a company called Open Plan to support the production of Hayton's Plan and it is anticipated that a funding application will be made in April 2020 with their support.

Initial feedback was sought during the coffee morning at the Village Hall on 20 December 2019. Howard Oates kindly collated the feedback and the Working Party will consider this as it continues to consult with residents about their preferences and desires for the village.

We are always eager for more residents to join the Working Party so please do contact one of the Parish Councillors if you are interested.
